# New Resources in Biblical Studies for Jewish Studies (Pedagogy)

Sunday, December 19, 1:00-2:30 pm, Superior A

This session will bring together three new resources in biblical studies that should be considered for their contributions to the broader teaching of Jewish Studies. Those resources are *The Posen Library of Jewish Culture and Civilization, Volume 1: Ancient Israel, from Its Beginnings through 332 BCE* and the accompanying Posen Digital Library, *The Jewish Annotated Apocrypha*, and the Ancient Jew Review web journal.

#### 1943: A Pivotal Year

Sunday, December 19, 4:45–6:15 pm, Missouri

For the Jews, 5703/1943 was a year of radical, unprecedented choices: between rhetoric and rescue, diplomacy and activism, resistance and passivity, past and future, redemption and apocalypse. The divide between one calendar and another was the distance between wartime and what came next. None of the existing Jewish master narratives anticipated a world war against the Jews. Scholars working in diverse areas of Jewish culture will explore Jewish responses during this transformative year of 1943.
